Dear Parent/Guardian:

Welcome to Kid's Corner Child Care and Preschool. Kid's Corner has offered home child care and preschool for children ages three months through school age since 1996. My state licensed childcare program is not a formal classroom setting; however, I do offer a structured preschool program for those children who are interested. I believe children learn valuable lessons through self-directed play and through this play I am teaching the children new concepts each day. The children are offered a variety of developmentally appropriate activities inside and outside and I've created a loving, comfortable, and secure environment where the children can explore, create, learn, play, and have fun.

My most important objective is to provide your child with a safe, clean and nurturing environment, in which he/she will know that he/she is loved, valued and wanted. It's also important that when you leave your child with me each day you feel reassured and confident about the care your child is receiving.

The following is a handbook of policies set forth to maintain a smooth working relationship between all parties. Please read through it thoroughly as it contains important information that will make our time together seamless. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to ask. If changes need to be made, such changes will be made to you via writing, text or email.

I look forward to caring for and teaching your child all the while watching them grow.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATIONS

When you sign and agree to the terms of this contract, you are also allowing for the application of sunblock, non-prescription baby powder and non-prescription diaper changing ointment, as needed. If you don't provide sunblock, one of SPF 30 or more will be applied for the afternoon only. Please provide a lotion sunblock rather than spray. *The parent is responsible for applying sunblock in the morning before daycare.* I do not administer medication of any kind. On a slightly different note, please refrain from spraying your child with perfumes or colognes as others can be sensitive to these scents.

BEHAVIOR

Your child will be encouraged to use sharing and caring manners throughout the day as well as proper table manners. Positive reinforcement will be used when he/she is demonstrating acceptable behavior. Unacceptable behavior will be corrected by redirection, communication or the use of time-out.

Climbing over gates and/or out of pack-n-plays, as well as aggressive behavior such as hitting, biting, throwing toys, or physically harming another child is not allowed. Parents will be notified if this situation occurs at daycare and I ask that reinforcement be done at home to let the child know this is unacceptable behavior. Should the child continue to display this behavior and poses a risk to themselves or other children, for the safety of all the children enrolled in my care, immediate notice of termination may be given.

BIRTHDAYS/SPECIAL OCCASIONS

Birthdays and holidays are a fun and special time for children. I will provide a birthday or holiday snack and help to make the day a special one. I do provide each child with a small holiday gift. There is no gift exchange between children for birthday's or Christmas.

BITING

Biting is sometimes typical for toddlers as they are dealing with their frustration of not yet being able to verbally communicate their feelings. General biting behavior is addressed with communication and time-out. If biting is continuous, the biter will be placed in a pack-n-play for a time-out and any time I can't have my attention directly on them. (diaper changing time, bathroom time, set up for lunch etc.) If the biting becomes a constant, long term issue, termination from the daycare may be a necessary option, as my priority is the safety of all the children.

CLOTHING

I suggest supplying the following items: extra clothes and play shoes (if needed), diapers, wipes, sunscreen, hat, warm coat, mittens, underwear and socks. Sneakers are necessary for daycare with lace or velcro. No sandals, slip-on shoes, dressy shoes or crocs. This is for their safety while playing outdoors. Children with non-appropriate footwear will **not** be allowed on the climbing toys or bikes. If girls wear dresses, they need to have shorts or leggings underneath.

COMMUNICATION

Communication between parents and the provider is vital in maintaining a positive and healthy relationship. I want you to feel you can ask/talk to me about your child. I, too, want to feel I can share information about your child without feeling disregarded. I do send occasional pictures or messages via text. If I need to call out sick or close, I will text everyone as early as possible and ask for a response so I don't disturb any sleeping family members. If I don't get a response back from a text, I will then call.

Drop-off and pick-up times should be brief to make these often-chaotic transition times go smoothly. Although I'd like to talk to you at both times, my attention needs to be on the children so I can effectively supervise them and make sure they are safely interacting with each other. If there are any important issues regarding your child that I need to convey, I will share the information with you at pick-up or through a note or email. Also, there is no need to knock, just come on in. I may be at the changing table or feeding a baby so please don't be offended if I can't greet you at the door. You may be greeted by the dogs both outside or inside. They are a part of the daycare family and very friendly with everyone.

DAILY SCHEDULE

The schedule that follows is a loose guideline as to how the day will progress. I keep this flexible to meet the needs of all children and to take advantage of weather and spontaneous learning opportunities. Infants are unique and will be accommodated on a child-to-child basis. We are outdoors for longer periods of time during the nice weather.

IMMUNIZATIONS

All children attending daycare shall be current with immunizations, as the State of CT requires. This is for the protection of the other children enrolled and my own family. Although I respect that some withhold immunizations for religious or personal reasons, there are no exceptions at Kid's Corner.

INFANT CARE

Infants have their own unique schedule. The first year with a baby is always changing so we just go along with how the baby is developing. I suggest to keep things simple by supplying bottles and formula, baby food, diapers, wipes and several sets of extra clothes. Feel free to stock me up and I will tell you when I'm low. No need to bring a diaper bag daily or anything else, for that matter, as I have everything it takes to care for babies. Upon drop-off, simply remove the baby from the car seat, (or I will), and place the car seat in the garage on the way out. You will receive a short report about how the day went at the end of the day, until the baby turns one. Babies have plenty of activity time, including floor play and tummy time. They are held often and go along with our preschool activities. When we go outside, they are in the stroller or a pack-n-play with toys until they are old enough to do otherwise safely.

The parents of infants must provide bottles, baby cereal, baby snacks and baby food. They are bottle fed as needed and at 4 months, start baby food at lunch before a bottle. I ask that babies be fed their morning cereal and /or bottle at home. To ensure the comfort of your infant, I also ask that babies be well adjusted to the bottle, whether it is breast milk or formula, before beginning childcare in my home. To ensure order during the day with the kids and our schedule, I do not allow for drop-in breastfeeding. Bottles are made as needed and served cold or warmed. After a child turns one, all infants use a sippy cup from that point forward and around 10 months, if not sooner, regular table food should be introduced. I suggest that parents start the transition to milk in the sippy cup around 10-11 months. I start offering water in a sippy cup around 6 months. I expect you to trust my judgment when it comes to the amount of formula and food your baby needs throughout the day. If I think a baby is hungry for more formula than normal, I will make up more and offer it. Likewise, with food: most babies are ready to eat cereal at 4 months. By 6 months, I will offer cereal and a fruit or veggie for lunch. Some babies will still need a bottle before afternoon nap, but many outgrow this bottle when they begin eating a complete lunch. Around 11 months, I wean the babies off the morning nap and they will have morning snack with the big kids.

As recommended by the State of Connecticut Health Department, in an effort to reduce the risk of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, all babies are placed on their backs for nap time. You and I understand this is only a recommendation and that the actual cause of SIDS is unknown. When infants start to roll over on their own, I will not reposition them on their backs while they sleep. I don't rock babies to sleep. Very young infants (1-2 months) will sometimes nap in their car seat or in the swing by my side until they are comfortable in the crib. Infants will nap 8:45-9:45 in addition to an afternoon nap. No pacifiers are used within the daycare. Please understand that I will not wake up a napping baby to feed them, but they will be given a bottle after nap time should they sleep through their scheduled feeding.

INTRODUCTION PERIOD

The first week of childcare can be traumatic for some children (and parents). It is not unusual for some of them to become quite tearful. However, it has been my experience that the children calm down quickly once the parent leaves. During this transitional period feel free to text or email me later in the day to put your mind at ease. There will be a two-week trial attendance period. This will allow us the opportunity to discuss the routine, your child's attendance and to determine if we can all work well together. Childcare can be a wonderful experience for all parties if placement is right. If after one to two weeks your child has not adjusted by continuing to cry, scream or is physically harming other children, alternative daycare will be suggested. Payment would still be expected until the child's last day.

I do everything possible to keep the day care area as clean as possible, so please be considerate and have children remove their shoes when entering my home and place them in the closet or in the garage on the rug. I also ask that you say hellos/good-byes in the entrance room so dirt isn't tracked through the playroom. The children and babies are crawling on the floor throughout the day and the floors should be as dirt-free as possible. Even I have my indoor and outdoor shoes ☺

This set-up also allows for quick and simple good-byes. As tempting as it is to cuddle a child who is having difficulty with separation, I suggest a quick hug and kiss good-bye. In my experiences, I have found that if I then take the child into the playroom and distract them with an activity, they calm rather quickly.

For the safety of the children, no enrolled child or sibling is allowed to run around my yard, driveway or playground at pick-up time.

LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Mixed age groups teach children to take care of each other and themselves. My childcare program is not a formal classroom setting; however, I do offer a structured preschool program for those children who are interested. I offer your child a variety of developmentally appropriate activities inside and outside. One of the nice advantages of home daycare is that your child gets to spend his/her early years in a small group setting surrounded by the warmth and comfort of a home. There will be plenty of time for children to interact in large groups, have completely structured days, and learn. I believe kids need time to be kids. ☺

MATERNITY LEAVE / MEDICAL LEAVE

If you know you're expecting a child and would like child care for the baby, please let me know as soon as possible so hopefully a spot can be held for that child. Regular tuition is expected during maternity leave. If the situation arises where several moms are pregnant and space is limited, I have the choice to honor the client who has been enrolled the longest; however, it is always at my discretion as to which child will stay. I will gladly help in finding you a new provider if a spot can't be reserved for your new baby. During a maternity leave full payment is expected for all siblings regardless of attendance, too.

MEALS

I will provide your child with snack and water in the morning and afternoon. I ask that you provide your child with a nutritious lunch and I will provide milk. I have a microwave so feel free to send in a variety of foods. Self-feeding is an important skill for young children to learn and one they really enjoy. Lunches for children over 12 months should be ones they are able to feed themselves. Please make sure food is fully-prepared and cut into appropriate sizes for your child to eat. I will gladly assist your child while he or she is learning this new skill but please keep in mind that spoon-feeding entire meals is only done for young infants.

If your child has dietary restrictions, food allergies, or requires all-natural foods, you will need to notify me and provide all the food, which includes lunch, snack, and beverages.

I encourage good table manners and teach the children that cleaning their area and pushing in their chair is their responsibility. Please be aware that eating time can also be a messy time. For this reason, I ask that several sets of extra clothes be left in your child's cubby so they can be changed when necessary.

Please note that if the daycare opens late (after 9) or closes early (3:00), or if on inclement weather days everyone arrives after 8:30, no morning snack is served.

OUTDOOR PLAY

I believe children need fresh air as often as possible and need the experiences of “just being a kid” by playing outdoors. Therefore, I do provide outdoor playtime, weather permitting. The children enjoy playing on the driveway and on the playground. I will gladly change your child into clean clothes that you have provided in their cubby if they are terribly filthy at the end of the day. If they are just dusty from sand or dirty from the typical spills a child endures, they will not be changed. Children under 9 months will play on a blanket in the yard, in the portable crib, swing, or stroller. Most babies 10 months and up are ready to be pushed in the baby buggies on the driveway, start crawling on the grass or like to be held on the slides and therefore need shoes or heavy duty slippers. If the weather is warm, shorts are necessary, especially seeing how hot the kids get while running. Yes, they will endure the occasional scrape, cut or “boo-boo”. They are kids and it’s expected! I encourage them to get back up and keep going. ☺ I don’t bring the kids outside for snow play, so no need for snow pants and boots.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Pictures of the children playing are taken so that I can email or text them to you during the day. They are not publicly shared on the daycare Facebook page or via any other source. If you choose to share a picture of your child, I ask that you use discretion and respect and not post/share pictures that have the other children in them unless permission is granted from their parents.

PRESCHOOL

I have incorporated a preschool program into my childcare services in hopes that your child will be able to remain in my home until school age. The preschool curriculum is for children over 2 years old who are interested in the program and are emotionally and developmentally ready to participate. Age is not the only factor to take into consideration when beginning a preschool program. Children develop their skills differently and at their own time and learn best when they are developmentally ready.

PROPERTY DAMAGE

Respectful treatment of all toys, furniture and vehicles in the driveway is expected at all times. Parents may be asked to pay for any destruction of property that they or their child causes.

REST TIME

This portion of the day is for the benefit of all. Daily rest time takes place from 12:30-2:30/2:45. Children have their own crib or mat, blanket and pillow, which are washed weekly. Children who no longer sleep will continue with quiet rest time, during which only books are allowed. Please refrain from picking up during this time.

SICK POLICY/SICK TIME/INJURY

In the interest of all children, it is best to keep a sick child at home if they have any of the following conditions: a contagious disease, a continuous mucous cough along with sinus congestion, a continuous runny nose and an excessive amount of sneezing in which constant nose wiping is needed, a fever of 100 or higher, a draining rash or sore, eye discharge or Pinkeye, lice or nits, diarrhea, vomiting or any other illness that requires an excessive amount of individual adult attention. Please note that children with any undiagnosed skin rash may not attend daycare until the rash is diagnosed and you have a note from the doctor clearly stating it is not contagious. Children with the common cold may attend daycare. Due to sanity reasons, I do not use a nose syringe. Any child who is injured and wearing a cast (removable or permanent), brace, sling or has had surgery may return to daycare when they are fully able to participate in our program. They will need a note from the doctor stating they are able to return to daycare without restrictions. Please understand that if your child needs to remain immobile or kept away from other children they will need to be kept at home. If your child is unwell enough that he/she needs to be seen by a doctor, then please make arrangements to keep your child home that day, as it’s in the best interest of their daycare friends.

Your child needs to stay home for 24 hours after beginning any antibiotic, 24 hrs after an episode of diarrhea, vomiting or fever, 48 hrs after a contagious illness, one week after hand, mouth, foot disease and at least one week after any surgery or the onset of the flu or pneumonia. Your child should be free and clear of flu symptoms and be ready to actively participate. Again, I can’t reiterate this enough—I can’t effectively supervise and care for other children when my attention is focused on an un-well child. This is also in the best interest of the other families in my care and my own family. Although these policies are in place and doctors may say otherwise, the final discretion will be up to me depending on circumstances.

Please keep in mind that although your child may wake with no fever and seems “fine” or didn’t wake with diarrhea or vomiting, following several days of having one of these, it doesn’t necessarily mean your child is ready for a busy day at daycare. This is why I have the 24-48 hr. policy and it helps minimize any illness from being passed on to another child or adult in my home. I must be informed if your child has been given any medication prior to arriving for child care. This includes any over the counter meds. In case of a medical emergency, it is important for attending emergency personnel to know if a child has taken any medication.

Due to the uncertainty of how a child may respond after vaccines are administered, I ask that your child be kept home for the remaining portion of the day after shots are given.

As a parent, you should know best when it is more appropriate for your child to be comforted by you at home. When your child is sick, you should let me know as soon as possible. When your child becomes ill in my home or experiences an injury, I will notify you to discuss treatment and/or early or immediate pick-up. Emergency 911 will be called if justified and first aid will be applied if necessary. If I send your child home sick, they must remain out of daycare the following day.

Please understand that if your child is crying continuously or is inconsolable for more than 2 hours, I can only assume they are not feeling well and you will be called to pick up your child. If your child is on medication that causes the excessive crying and it continues for more than two hours and/or is disruptive or upsetting to the other children, you will be called to pick up your child and you will need to make arrangements to keep your child at home until they are feeling better and are ready to participate in our program. As you can image, an environment with a screaming child for an extended period of time becomes disruptive and upsetting to the other children.

SMOKING, ALCOHOL OR DRUGS

There is absolutely no smoking, alcohol or drugs permitted on the property, inside and outside, at any time. For the safety of my family and all preschool families, I cannot accept any convicted felons as clients or anyone who has been arrested for crimes against children.

TOILET TRAINING

When the time presents itself, I will gladly help with toilet training. Some children are ready to train after two and others wait until 3. Some children start using the toilet and then regress only to go back to diapers for several more months. My belief is that, although with guidance toilet training is possible early on, most children do it when they are ready. Kid’s Corner only accepts disposable diapers and store wipes. No cloth diapers or homemade wipes are allowed due to sanitary reasons. All children are changed on a regular basis to lessen the chance of diaper rash. Pull-ups are allowed when I determine the time during the potty training process is right.

TOYS

I provide age and developmentally appropriate toys for the children. Special toys or stuffed animals may be brought in for sharing or rest time. If you think that your child will have difficulty sharing a toy that you bring or you don’t want to chance it breaking, please keep it at home. I will not be responsible for broken or lost toys that your child brings into my home. Please make sure that your child does not bring any gum, candy, coins or other small items when they come to day care. No jewelry is allowed, including teething necklaces, bracelets or anklets. These items are choking hazards to all of the children.

TRAVEL

I do not travel with the daycare children.

VISITATION

It’s only natural for a parent to miss their child during the day and I would never discourage a parental visit, but I have found that these pop-in visits negatively affect the child and disrupt our routine. The child feels it is time for them to go home and can’t understand when mommy or daddy leaves them all over again in the same day. If you do feel the need to stop in during the day, plan on taking your child home with you when you leave. The same is necessary if you schedule a mid-afternoon appointment--please plan on keeping your child home with you for the remaining portion of the day. If your child is in the Birth to Three program, I ask that you schedule visits at your home.

WATER PLAY

Warm spring days offer the children fun in the sprinkler or kiddie pool. By signing this contract, you acknowledge the water play portion of this contract.

BUSINESS INFORMATION

BUSINESS FORMS

In order to secure your child's spot at Kid's Corner, you will need to return the following forms. Also, each May, a new yearly handbook and contract will be issued.

HOURS OF OPERATION AND DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

Kid's Corner Child Care is open from 7:30-4:30, Monday through Friday. Due to family obligations before and after hours, I am unable to accommodate requests for early drop-offs or late-pick-ups. On days when there is a two-hour school delay, the daycare will open at 8:30. If school is dismissed early, the daycare will close at 3:00. Anytime school is closed, the daycare is closed, except for in building teacher professional development days. (A complete list of closures is under Tuition) If there are too many snow days and the South Windsor school system has to open on either February or April vacation for any amount of days, the daycare will open on those days (unless I have pre-paid to travel for a family vacation). If I need to open late (around 9) or close early (after 2:30 or later) the day is considered a full day.

If you are going to be late dropping off OR picking up, please call or text me. Because my family time after my workday is important to me, a \$25.00 per-child late pick-up fee will be charged. However, I'd much rather you pick-up on time. I ask that you please regard my service as a business and afford me the same respect and consideration you would other professionals.

I will not release a child to anyone who appears to be under the influence of alcohol or any other substance that would impair their driving ability. I will also check the id of any unfamiliar person picking up your child. I will also not release a child without a proper car seat or booster seat installed.

PERSONAL AND VACATION TIME

I have been providing quality care for over 24 years and the daycare is open almost 50 hours a week. I will be taking the following paid holidays and vacation days in order to spend time with my family and maintain a high energy level to care for your child. This typically follows the school year calendar.

This policy also includes 6 paid personal days/half day time, (this includes Veteran's Day), 5 paid sick days (which covers sickness, recovery from surgery or any other medically related incident), 1 paid jury duty day and 5 paid funeral days. If any other time off is needed, it will be unpaid. Payment is expected before any time away and will not be deposited until the appropriate day.

In the event that the school calendar changes after this contract is published, the daycare will follow those changes. The only reason the changes wouldn't be followed is if I had prepaid for a vacation.

REPORTING CHILD ABUSE

Licensed providers in the State of Connecticut are legally required to report immediately to the police or Department of Children and Families any reason to suspect child abuse, neglect, or exploitation. We are not obligated to inform parents/guardians of this report. The number for the Office Early Childhood for information about family day care is 1-800-282-6063.

TUITION

A full time, school year space has been reserved for your child, regardless of attendance. Tuition will be due each Thursday before 4:30 for the following week and is expected until the last day of school. The daycare will close during the following and your tuition is expected: school closures, virtual learning days, snow days, health pandemic, power outages, emergency weather related closings or if any type of state of emergency is issued. Please remember you are paying for the daycare spot and your tuition holds the space for your child during such closures. The daycare continues to close on snow days even if virtual learning is in effect. If you choose to withdraw from child care only to reinstate at a later time when a long term closure is over, you would be responsible for the back pay of weeks you were gone before coming back, and that would only be if your spot was still available. Payment in the form of Venmo or PayPal is accepted. If your school system is open and South Windsor is closed, the daycare is closed. Part time arrangements may be available and will be discussed on an individual basis; however, preference will be given to full time positions.

Tuition

*All ages--\$260.00. Part time daily rate \$65.00. Tuition is paid for the school year only, which is August 31, 2020-the last day of school.

*Each space is full time and no sibling discount is offered.

*There will be a yearly increase in tuition, up to but no more than 3% weekly, to start each new contract period.

Retaining Fees (all non-refundable)

*Enrollment fee-\$100.00. The registration fee allows me to continue to maintain a quality program by replenishing and replacing items that experience wear and tear such as books, toys, rest mats and eating supplies (cups, plates utensils). This fee is also used to enhance the program with the purchase of additional enrichment activities, furniture or larger toys which are not a part of the normal operating budget.

*All ages - Starting date 3 weeks or less from signing date – 1 week non-refundable deposit

*All ages - Starting date 4 weeks or more from signing date – 2 weeks non-refundable deposit

*To hold a spot for more than one month, the weekly fee will be determined based on current enrollment.

*Parents forfeit the full deposit and enrollment fee should they decide for any reason to terminate this contract prior to the starting date shown on the agreement form.

WITHDRAWAL/TERMINATION

When my services are no longer required, I ask that you please give me two weeks' notice. Payment is due for these two weeks on the day I am notified of exiting the daycare. I, too, can give two weeks' notice if it is necessary for the child to leave the daycare and/or if the provider chooses to for any reason. If a negative situation presents itself and we are unable to work through things for two weeks, then immediate termination or withdrawal will be allowed on either part for any reason. If I give immediate termination, no payment is required on your part. If, however, you the parent give immediate termination, payment for two weeks is still required on the day of notice. Although reasonable steps will be taken to avoid termination, reasons for termination may include non-payment, failure to honor the obligations listed in the contract, personality conflicts or child/parent behavior. An exit form to confirm termination will be printed and signed by the provider and both parents. Parents are responsible for any and all legal fees, collections fees, court fees, and any and all fees related to collecting an unpaid balance of any kind.

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Policy Agreement

In signing below, you are agreeing that you have taken the necessary time to read the Policy Handbook and each of its policies thoroughly. You further agree to comply with all the policies, terms and conditions that are set forth within the Handbook.
